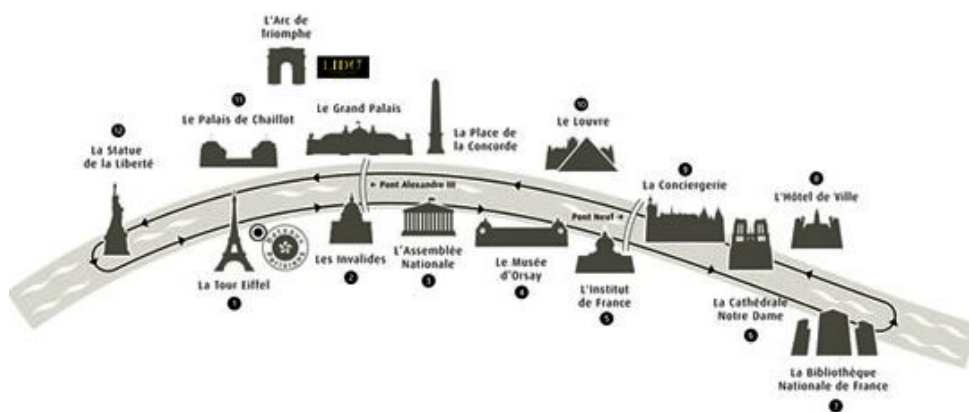

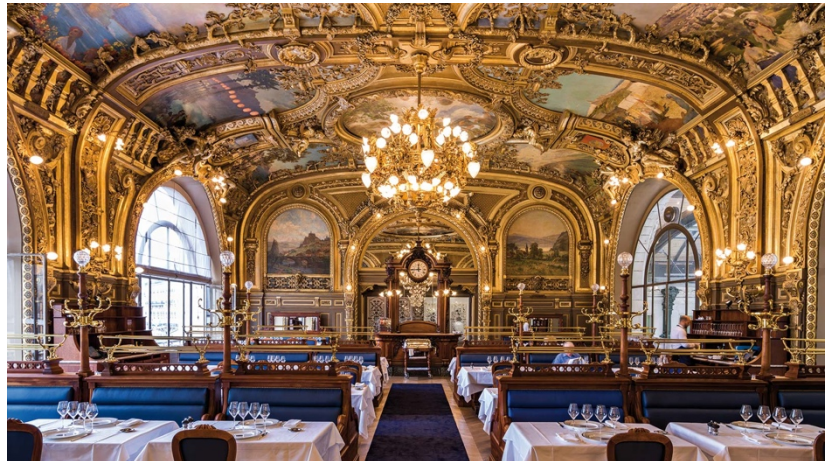

A MYTHICAL PLACE OF: FROM 1900 UP TO NOW

The railway station buffet was inaugurated in 1901 by the Republic President Emile Loubet.

In 1963, Albert Chazal renamed the le buffet « Le Train Bleu », in honor of the mythical « Paris-Vintimille », a legendary train with la Côte d'Azur destination. Coco Chanel, Brigitte Bardot, Jean Cocteau, Colette, Gabin, Marcel Pagnol and more personalities were regular visitors of Train Bleu, whereas other films scenes were realized there: « Nikita » of Luc Besson, « Place Vendôme » of Nicole Garcia, « Les vacances de Mr Bean » of Steve Bendelack and « Filles Uniques » of Pierre Jolivet.
